

THE FOOD PANTRY AT ST. PAUL'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH,

KC,KS. MANY THINGS ARE HAPPENING AT THE PANTRY!

Two of them are very important to the Pantry's future.

After many years being under the umbrella of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in KCK, the pantry is now under the leadership of NourishKC (formerly ECS). A few steps were taken in late 2017 with formal transition in 2018. The pantry will remain at St Paul's and everything at the pantry remains the same; just the financial and formal leadership moved to NourishKC. The pantry will become a model of what other pantries under NourishKC will be able to accomplish.

The other change will be bulk food donations. As of April 1, 2018, the pantry will no longer be able to break down bulk items of any kind, including food, soaps, sugar, TP, etc. All items must be sealed in original wrappings. The USDA has set up new guidelines that the pantry must follow or it can be shut down. Any items that are broken down must be broken down in a "clean room" per the USDA. The pantry advisory committee is looking at different options as we move forward with this hurdle.

The pantry is open twice a week—Wednesday and Saturdays. All volunteers are welcome, no experience necessary and children can volunteer as long as parents stay with them at all times. Wednesday pantry hours are 12:00 - 2:30pm and Saturday hours are 10:00am - 12:30pm, but with both shifts please arrive 30-60 minutes earlier to help set up. Saturday, April 14, 2018 is St. Thomas' turn to volunteer at the pantry. Please come and join us. The pantry is open from 10am-1pm but we need everyone there at 9:00am to get assigned a job and help unload the ECS van with donated food from Whole Foods. We will need help with sorting food, stocking shelves, shopping with the neighbors and checking in neighbors. Questions? contact Donna Fye 913-963-5815 or diffyee@gmail.com.

What the pantry needs: jelly, skillet dinners, baking mixes, bars of bath soap, canned spinach, small bottles of cooking oil (can be found at Dollar General), canned meats and with the new USDA rules any small containers/packages of coffee, sugar, flour, dish soap, rice, pasta, dry beans. All items can be placed in the red wagons in the Narthex.


