So, just what exactly is in that "Little Black Box"?

Lay Eucharistic Visitors are lay ministers who take communion from our Sunday service to shutins, primarily people in assisted living facilities/ homes, hospitals, and to others who cannot be with our parish family for service due to illness or special circumstances. The Lay Eucharistic Visitor tradition dates back to the earliest years of the Christian church, serving the homebound and inva-



lid. Our Lay Eucharistic Visitors are trained at St. Thomas and licensed by the Bishop. Each week they go forth and carry the sacraments of bread and wine to those they visit so they may share with us in the communion of Christ's body and blood. "We who are many are one body, because we all share one bread, one cup." Lay Eucharistic Visitors care and tend to those they visit both spiritually and emotionally, and often reflect on the readings and/or the sermon. In addition, they share with one another what is currently going on in the life and community of St. Thomas, the world, and within our personal lives, enabling a growth in relationship with one another and with Christ.


