O come, O come Emmanuel is a paraphrase of a Latin text that was found in plainchant antiphons attached to the *Magnificat* sung at Vespers before the final days before Christmas. Even today, our hymnal shows the days when each verse is appropriately sung. Chant based, the hymn is not metered. However, many modern hymnals set the tune in common time using a 4/4 meter signature. Our praise band setting uses the original Dorian mode with the modern time signature.

They meet on the 4th Monday of each month, and in addition they help lock and unlock the church on the weekends.
