
Luke 3:11 Project

Notes on the Notes—Dr. Beth Elswick, Dir. of Music Ministry

To Carol is to dance---a circle dance. Listen to the dance rhythms of Comfort, comfort ye, my people. Many of our Advent and Christmas songs have origins in carols. Listen to the dance rhythms. We have great stories to tell.

Comfort, Comfort ye my people is a paraphrase of Isaiah 40. The composer, Claude Goudimel (1514-1572) set the music to the rhythm of the text. The modern version in our hymnal shows bar lines, but the music was actually composed prior to the modern idea time signatures. Hence, the music totally centers on the poetry. Often the stresses are 3 beats, 3 beats, 2 beats, 2 beats, 2 beats. The pattern 3+3+2+2+2 is a frequent rhythmic scheme in the hymn. This pattern is found in Renaissance dance music. Not surprisingly, the song works wonderfully well when sung at a faster pace with more modern harmonies as it appears in the praise service setting. The rhythms that are not set in a standard 4/4 meter are fun for the band. Jazz and rock music often include rhythmic surprises. Historically, these early rhythmic patterns facilitated the dance craze of the Baroque period and led to the use of bar lines----a most important development in Western Art Music. Remember to carol is to dance.
