IHN HOST WEEK SIGNUPS ON BULLETIN BOARD

Signup Sheets for Volunteers and Food/Supplies

Our St. Thomas Host week serving situationally homeless families and single women will be Feb. 16 - Feb. 23, 2020. IHN guests will stay evenings and overnight here at St. Thomas, sleeping in classrooms converted to sleeping rooms. With help from our Support Congregations we will also provide all meals that week.

IHN consists of 40 congregations of many different denominations. Twelve "Host" congregations provide evening/overnight shelter and meals for families and women. The other "Support" congregations help by sending volunteers and supplies needed. At the day-time Family Center guests receive intense, one-on-one counseling, opportunities to learn financial and budgeting skills with additional support to improve needed skills such as computer assistance, job searches and interview skills.

Volunteers interacting with guests must have completed one 2-hr training session presented by IHN trainers. IHN also asks that all trained volunteers attend training as a refresher at least every 3 years. Volunteers for setup or takedown of classrooms or launder bedding after Host week ends do not need to be trained by IHN.

Notes on Notes—

Beth Loeber Elswick, Director of Music Ministry

The lessons today feature a variety of images all leading to the Gospel Lesson. God's faithfulness and love is expressed in John the Baptist's proclamation, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world!"

Isaiah refers to "the Lord, who is faithful." The Psalmist says, "let thy steadfast love and thy faithfulness preserve me forever." In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul says, "Jesus Christ will sustain you to the end. . .God is faithful."

John identifies Christ claiming, "Behold, the Lamb of God." What a loaded image! (Old Testament of Cain and Abel with grain vs. sheep sacrifice; later Abraham offering Isaac as a sacrifice until God provides a ram, the Blood of the lamb on the doorposts at the Exodus from Egypt, David tending sheep, and Christ as the Good Shepherd). Faithful shepherds, sacrificial lambs, the Lamb of God. All of the music today reflects the importance of God's faithfulness to his people and the ultimate sacrifice, "Behold, the Lamb of God."
